Most electronic duos seem to have hits instantly. Not so Dave Stewart and Annie Lennox. Dave Rimmer finds out why it's taken them so long.

"Fearing you should any that," muces Down Stowert of the Enrythmics when your reporter mentions, emong other groups, Yozoo. Dever, you see, lives in North London — jeat resumd the conterr bappener. This searching he got up and went out to the shops. Do the way down the rooth he possiad a familiar face — Adrian Wright from The Hames Leaguest. And then when he got to the Alf from Yearo bersy stocking up on the first and not.

"Yes... funny," Deve continues. "We do like Yezoo's stuff. In fact we fike e lot of stuff at the moment."

The other helf of Eurythmics, Annie Lennox, nods vigorously in egreoment. "There are lots of people meking great pop music these days. It's wonderful! It's our celture."

Noble sentiments these from e group who one might forgive a little bittemess. After all, they were one of the first of the current corp of synth does, but sy until their current thi "Sweet Draums (Are Mede DI This)" "Sweet Draums (Are Mede DI This)" reletive obscurity while all sorts of similar bands heve come e(ong.

"Yeeh, come and game!" retorts Annie who's much too sensible to let e little thing like the leck of instant success worry her, "while we're just about to emerge."

"Any other time wouldn't have been right for us," adds Deve. "We wouldn't have been ready."

But getting ready has taken them a fair old time. This pair both have musical histories that go back a long wey. So, are you sitting combartably? Let's meet the Eurythmics...

Annie Lennox is serious, telketive, confident end 28 years old. A netive of Aberdeen, she studied flute, herpsichore and pismo et London's Royal Academy ol Music for three years before dociding to give it all up and become a singer.

She did odd jobs like weitressing end working in bookshops while looking for kindred spirits with whom she could meke some music. She did e bit of cabaret work, then someone introduced her to Dave.

"I knew from the minute we met I was going to be working with him. It was great!"

Dave Stewart is 30, comes from Sunderland, and is every bit as bright end triendly as Annie. He started playing quiter at the age of 13 while in hospital after a football injury, and got into his first bend — a marcifully long-defunct banch of modieral — by stowing away in the back of their van end leoping out brendishing his guiter whan they arrived in Scendhorpe.

After that he pleyed in "every different kind of beend you can think of, from 50k to tenk", before anding up working with a chep celled Peet Coombes. Which is what he was doing when he bumped into Annie ...

This was arkand 1977. Bends were bissaming everywhere. The three of them formed The Toerists. Dure and Annie startel University that the three presently The Toerists started having this. In eli, between 1978 and 1980, het band mode three elbums and fire singles, the base retemembers of which was a cover of an old Dusty Springflaud song. 7 Uohy Wanne Be With Yes", which made it to number 3. Tongue-in-cheek or not, everybody et the time eccused The Tourists of the hideces crime of "selling out". These days if a quite trendy to like, zey, Becks Fizz. Then, es Annie puts it: "if you ware in the least bit commercial everybody heted you."

In this stmosphere of fear and loathing, The Tourists began to despair of being taken seriously. The public face of the bend seemed to have nothing to do with how it fail. Their reletionships began to datariorate and, at the end of 1980, they called it a day.

"It wes," reckens Annie, "the most honest thing we could do."

She and Dave had enyway been gatting led up with it for other reasons. Peet Coorbes — O y all accounts an add chep heft-bent on "living out totel cheas" and now a total recluze — was the principal writer in the group. The rest didning ter look-in. Deve end Annie hed already decided to do something on their even. The minute The Tourists died, Eurythmics rose from the exters.

At the seme time, their refetionship broke up. With hindslight, Dave considers this e "psychologically wise decision. We couldn't seriously

While busy being normal in their private lives, in the Eurythmics they were clustered round a cheep little Wesp synthesizer writing songs like fury. This they found a huge relief eiter having hed to work in a conventional best draws guiter line-up.

Also a relief was the decision to keep it just the two of them. They'd been fed up with the "diplomatic thing" of "putting up with other people's personalities end idea". Between the pair of them there'd elways been e "mutuel respect".

"We're either both leeping around going thet's greet, thet's greet," Deve chuckles, "er et ench other's thronts going it's not, it's not!" But it's never Indifferent."

Buickly, a debut elbum, "In The Gerden", was recorded with Germen producsr Canay Plenck, Blendie drummer Clem Burke, end verlous Germen musicians like Robert Gorl frem DAF eed the slightly loony 'sound-painter' Holger Czukcy. It was released fatter thet yet bil remembered how much they head The Tourists.

That reputation, Annie remembers with a trace of sourcess, "was like a gray shadow with me every bloody day for a while. It's off me now though."

Despite the general leck of interest, the peir of them continued to work herd; releasing singles contaking e grant dear of cost over making the scompenying videos themselves. Recently, the core was reverded. The video for their lest single, "Leve 1a A Strenger", which features Annie in e variety of male roles, received an award for the best video of lest year. francisch, it was elso besned in the Strete.

Deve reaches new heights of enthusiasm describing their "Sweet Derems" video. It begins with Annie benging her fist on the table in e record compeny beardroom, linken cuts to e recket taking off for the moon. Meenwhile Annie gestures to globe with a locturer's batton singing "sweet dreams are made of this".

It's e question about technology. Are droams really made of fency new godgetry like all that stuff Whem! and others were modelling in the last Smash Hits?

And then e cow wenders on to the screen.

"It's a bit off the well," Dave admits, "but ensimels, no matter what's happening, just go one eating the gress. They don't have to go off flying to the moon or make a million dollar doel to know that they're OK."

This question about the worth of new technology is a continuing proaccupation of theirs. Deve gets sent a lot of "badroom topes" by young like an old Woolworth's guiter, say, or a single merce played along with some super-modern bit of cheep symbelsizet technology.

"You get a whole mish-mush of things, which is like today. I mean outside," Dava gestures out of the window of RCA records down at the electric shops on Fortenheer Court Road, "you get ell these shops full of electronic junk. And them there is still the old tremp welking along with en old piece of bered."

This contrast between the old and the new, between the "neturel" and the technological, is something they hope they reflect in their music. The tansion between Annie's strong soulful voice, perheps, and the smert, shing synthesizer becking.

Here, by the way, is where Yezo come into the conversion. Amine and Dave also point to Culture Club, Malcolm McLaren and the Associates or exempted whet they like about pop music at the moment. They obmire people who deve from a veriety of sources. They siso admire people who write good songs

## The country boy who invented rock and roll and sold more records than anyone. Ever David Hepworth relates an extraordinary story.

A lot of what tollows isn't strictly true. The essential facts of Usis Presleys if the are all either shrouded in mystery or enshrined in myth and the only man capable of telling fact from fiction, Presley Immself, was builted in 1977. He was born in a shack in Tupelo, Mississippi, January 8, 1955 to poor parents. His twin brother, Jesse, didn't survive childbirth. 

Ever since their stunning debut performance on The Oxford Roadshow a couple of months back, a gang of street-wise ragamuffins by the unlikely name of JoBoxers have been the hot tip as contenders for the Soul Rebel" title left vacant when Kevin Rowland forsook the street for the countryside. Mixing measures of swing, Northern soul and Bar-Room blues with cocky humour and youthful bravado, these boys have blazed a trail into the public eve. And most of that was before they'd even left a vinyl calling-card.

JoBoxers may be a recent phenomenon, but the foundations were laid when Bristolians Sean McLusky (drums), Dave Collard (keyboards), Chris Bostock (bass) and Rob Marche (Guitar) teamed up with crooner and hamburger chef Vic Godard as the swinging Subway Sect. Briefly fashionable but commercially ill-fated, the boys' frustration with the crooner grew and when showman Dig Wayne arrived on their doorstep via Ohio and New York City, he provided the catalyst to transform Subway Sect into JoBoxers.

RCA jumped in sharply and signed up the 'Boxers towards the tail-end of last year, and soon they were practising and perfecting their lethal mix.

By Decembar a new beat was born --- Boxer Beat. With musical influences that range from Prince Buster and early Kool & The Gang through '50s lazz to classy soul and current hot New York funk. Boxer Bent just had to be dynamite. And so it proved. Since their first 45 "Boxer Beat" (surprise surprise!) finally hit the streets in early February it's bounced along up the hit parade. A rousing, stomping and simple singalong of a signature tune, it represents only one side of

the 'Boxers and does little to prepare the punters for the sheer class, — sophistication, even — of the monsters to



member of Musical Youth, he likes playing cricket, doing his schoolwork and riding his bike.

In April they'll go beck to America to appear on the important Saturday Night Live TV show and to play e couple of concerts at the fits club there. Before that, they'll have completed a new single and in the autumn will record a new LP.
