





It's noon in Dallas, Texas, and Robart Plant is sizzling poolside in tha ridiculous 104 degree heat

Ha's relexing in preperation for a gruelling "26 detes in 35 deys" which will take him across the length and breadth of America. Then it's back to frosty old Britein (throughout November and December) to atart all over egain.

The man is positively brimming with excitement. This is his first 'officiel' outing since his deys with Led Zeppelin who, without any exeggeration, were the gisnts of heavy metel during the 70s.

Some people even believe thet this four-piece creeted heavy metel when they released their first LP, called "Led Zappelin (One)", beck in 1969.

They went on to meke nine more LPs and spawned a million Imitetors. And the figures thet surround the band are

staggering. There were over 400,000 advance ordars in Americe elone for their second (P, "Led Zeppelin Z", in 1989. In 1973 their menager Peter Grant 1973 their menager Peter Grant Least 30 million dollars. At the Knabworth Fostival In 78 they and 800,000 vertis of light. They weren tao much a bend es en Industry.

So how would Robart like Lad Zeppelin to be remembared?

"As innovators, it was the combination of our ell-out psealon for music. The right guys with the right pession meeting in the right drive-in," he says, seriously.

"We were sloweys considered to be mersuding hs of rockera. Paople only remember us for songe like "Whole Lotte Love" but they missed out on e lot of our subtlety."

And 10 years on, Robert has a monster hit in "Blg Log", a track aneaked off his last LP, "The Ten years ago Robert Plant was the figurehead of Heavy Metal — piercing vocals and hair about three feet long. Peter Martin finds he's mellowed a little since then.

The song was a deliberate attempt to make hia music more accessible, as he himself admits.

"I'm quite heppy to get across to a wider audience. I don't wanne be stuck on The Friday Rock Show: I belong there as much as I do The Cemden Palace. I really belong everywhere!"

"Big Log" also got Robert on to Top Of The Pops — incredibly, his first ever appearance — where he rubbed shoulders with the likes of Bananarama and The Lotus Eaters.

Whate does he see himself in today's music? "I'm like e thoroughbred horse that's been sired from good blood," he says earnestly. Come again?

"Well, my treck record is good But, really, I like e lot of new people like Bill Nelson and the Cocteau Twins. I can see similarities between us in mood. But that wouldn't be evident to the record huver." The adds

After so long away, what's he looking forward to most on the tour?

"I'll be really interested to sea what fens I'll attract. Some are bound to be people who've followed my cereer but they've got to understand thet I'll never play Led Zep songa. I don't want a Perry Como 'Golden Greats' situation!"

If thet's the case, what is the raal difference between the new and the old wey of working?

"Well, it's like the way Japen moved one way and then split and now Mick Kam is working with Midge Ure. It's almost like e workshop job. You ahould be able to piay any sort of mulic you like with any musicians you like. Led Zep was a truly wonderful thing but raelly, now, I'm no pert of it"


