

THOMPSON TWINS: Hold Me Now (Ariste) Lacking the quirky ingenuity which the "Quick Step" album made their ballmark, this is, nevertheless, a real grower with Tom removing his goggles and coming on all dewy-eyed and sloppy.

JULIAN COPE: Sunshine Playroom (Phonogrem) Unless you have fond memories of The Moody Blues" "Question" or Queen's "Bohemian Rhoppody". Copes hhree-part epic shouldn't seem familiar. It fuses an urgent rock song, a pleading bellad and a bormony chorus, tosses in the theme tune from Hawail Five-Oand then wrape itself up in the lash string arrangements of Paul Buckmoster (who applies the same magic touch to the new Nick Hoyward album). 




