## **WOULD YOU THROW UND**

So what makes perfectly normal people scream all the way through their concerts and start shedding valuable items of clothing? Chris Heath gets to the bottom of it.

Floods of tears are streaming down a hysterical girt's face. "Oh God!" she screams, "I've actually kissed one of them." At the front,
