This seems rather an odd statement for him to make a) because J. playing away! But the most ridiculous thing and I think the most dengerous thing about America is some of the evangelists they have preaching on television over here. Some of the stuff they come out with is frightening, absolutely frightening. Paul: One of the saddest things about America is they've had some of the best music. The best thing that ever came out of America was its music but they've consumed it and forgotten it. The British when they like something they tend to hold on to it. New York and they pierced holes in my eardrums. Nik: Whath


Pault . . . and then they put little tube things in the holes, so if I went swimming the water would go down the tubes into the inner eardrum. Nikt What are the tubes for?


