

T've heard same of the stuff he ling in Monaco and I really think he can make it. One of the sangs is a really sexy American roc thing - he's singing. And playing the guitar hihih. Aw, peaple forget, yau see, that although Andrew was reeeally laaoazy, when he wants ta he can ploy the guitar just fine. He just didn't do all that much for Wham! because he cauldn't be bathered. It's amazing, it's true — the ability was there and he just didn't are that people didn't think it was suppose he's naw haping far the ast laugh."

So. Gearge Michael is seeing his uddies, he visits his mum, his LP sniffed of ar nat - went stroight to umber ane, he's nat short af the odd "bab", he's ane af the biggest stars in the whole of the galacial populus and, yet, he sits here and aaks decidedly glum around the gills. What's wrang with the man? ar the next three-quarters of an haur, pap gooks, let us ponder further. Could it perhaps be that.

HE'S EMBARRASSED BY THE OLD WHAM! DAYS?

I'm not embarrassed by the whale Wham! thing at oll. I'm embarrassed by 'Bad Boys' — that was such a bad!" ord. The sang ond the videa, Bey are an embarrassment to me naw. Funnily enough I listened to Bad Bays' the other day and I uddenly realised that with the backing track I was trying to rip aff an ald Was Not Was sang 'Out Came The Freaks' and I realised now shitty and tinny it saunded in camparison to the ariginal. I thought t was good when we made it but I had na idea what I was daing because we were going through a management and stuff and then it taak me obout a week to realise it vas the warst thing we'd ever dane People still lave it to this day, too but I just can't see it myself. Na! I oven't turned my back an the shuttlecack doys. It was just that recard - I would never say I was emborrassed by Wham! because it was gaad fun, you knaw. I just can't see myself ever doing it again.

LIFE ISN'T AS MUCH FUN ANY MORE?

"It isn't as much fun any more. The olbum isn't fun fun fun, is it? It's nat like Wham! It's just . . . I've gat a bit like Whamil It's just ... I've gat a bit older and ... alsa I'm bored with grinning. The whale point of his shing with Whami was because it san't the way I felt any more, you know? It's, like, the things that

people posthumausly like with Wham! they wont me to da naw, the things they frawned an ot the time. And I've dane them. I mean, dan't osk me to go back twa years cas you didn't appreciate it then and you want me to do it a bit more naw. I just feel like saying Yau missed the boot! I've gone! I'm samewhere else naw." There oren't gaing to be any mare fun and games fram me because that's when I wos 18, 19, 20, 21 . . . um, OK I'm only 24, I'm not exoctly on ald man but...na, my life isn't as much fun any mare. I mean, fame when you

ariginally came acrass it is a lot of fun ond then it just becomes your ife. I can't pretend to wake up in the mornings any mare and ga Waaaaaarrgh! Yeeahaarrrgh! Great! I'm famaus, I'm famous!' I did feel like that for a while but it wears aff, you knaw? You can't just keep an looking for big thrills. Like, the first number ones and the China things, they were big thrills but eventually they start to run aut. I think I'm mare appreciative of things naw - things aren't whizzing past me any mare. I just don't spend all my time trying to have a great time ony more.

HE'S GOING TO MISS BEING ON TOP OF THE POPS

"I've refused to go on Top Of The Paps naw, yes. Um... I always hated daing it. I was a goad actor hihih! Na, actually, I hated it after the first six manths – you were always pushed around and the people weren't terribly ca-aperative and I never liked the camera work etcetera etcetero. It

was very frustrating. Just as you'd get to the best bit of your chareagraphy they'd go to some girl in a bathing suit waving a balloon obout. I would feel very uncamfartable gaing an there with all thase people standing around with their ballgans like it was a big circus. I already felt uncamfartable doing 'A Different Carner'. It warked with Wham! and it just doesn't wark with me any more. Mast people came to that canclusion — when they don't have to be on Top Of The Paps to tain their status they dan't da it I'll lase out but I just don't want to do it ony mare. It's not snobby – I just think that if you work at any prafession for five or six years at the end of every day you should be happy with what you've dane and I wouldn't be happy on there ony

HE TAKES HIMSELF FAR TOO SERIOUSLY?

'Agaahm ... I dan't think I toke nyself terribly seriausly. I've always taken myself seriausly. And I always taak the pop music I made for more seriously than most people gave me credit far. They thought it was Wheee! Throw another one aut!

MICHAEN ond being famous was the main thing and it wasn't. I think there's a glanng difference between the stuff that gets to number one these days and the most successful Wham! records, because they're different. One is pap music which is crofted

and the other is business. "As far as I'm cancerned the nings that come aut of the Stock Aitken and Waterman stable are just business and there's o huuuge difference between that and what I've dane. Ta me. And if people dan't recognised that, fine Originally people thought I was a bit of an air-head and now that I've set about changing that I've given myself a new problem – peaple laak of me and think 'Oach, he's fo possibly be a genuinely creative person. I mean, I connat toke aff this professional personality that you see naw — it's very pratective and very prafessional but there's na daubt that if we met in a club we'd probably hove o lot af fun, you knaw? I'm 24 plus the six years af business that I've picked up and I can't help that - there's nathing I con do about that."

HE'S NOT FAT 'N' HAPPY ANY MORE?

"I've been thin for quite o lang time now. Since people have heard I'm working out they think 'Gad! "Most Pop Music Is Offensive"

Can this really be The Housemartins talking? Why then do they bother releasing pop songs like their new single "Build"? Because, they tell Chris Heath, their sort of pop songs are very different from the rest. . .

he whole song," says Paul Heaton earnestly, "is a dig at architects. They should build for necessity, for health and for genuine human comfort. I wouldn't say there's many council estates in Hull built for any of those reasons really. He's talking about the new Housemartins single, "Build "I was thinking about the

countryside. I was in the Ecology Party for a year. Well, not in it, but friends with people in the German Green Party. That's much more radical than the one here - the British Ecology Party is more like a plant observation group. A friend got me nterested because before that I'd always thought that the countryside was a bit poofy and associated it with Sunday dr Anyway, high-rise living ultimately comes from landowners' greed - they don't want anything built in the countryside because it's their garden.

Fairly serious stuff, but then Housemartins records, deep down, always are fairly serious stuff. Their LP "The People Who Grinned Themselves To Death' is crammed with songs about such subjects - about how farmers abuse both the countryside and farm labour ("Me And The Farmer"), the uselessness of self-important greedy pop stars ("The Light Is Always Green"), the moral bankruptcy of white South Africans ("Johannesburg"), the awfulness of a greedy self indulgent uncaring generation who vote for a greedy uncaring Tory government ("Five Get Over Excited"), about how people are prepared to wave at the Queen while the society she represents robs them ("The People Who Grinned Themselves To Death") and so on and so on. And there's more on the way.

hese two things - not having anything to do with people whose views they despise and trying to avoid people who don't take them seriously - affect everything The Housemartins do. They refuse to play charity football matches if racist comedians like Stan Boardman" are in one of the teams: they've refused to speak on anti-apartheid platforms because members of the SDP or Liberals have been there. And while they hate groups being serious all the time they worry that people think of them as another one in the line of wacky bands, like Madness and maybe The Beatles.

That's why they hate people screaming at their concerts. Their recent tour was apparently "better" in that respect but, reading between the lines, seems pretty certain that, had lots and lots of screaming continued, they would have continued, they would have stopped playing concerts.
"I don't mind people enjoying us and having fun at our concerts," explains Paul, "but I want them to see us as people with a message. Maybe we





should use this as an opportunity to say we don't like screaming. We like people to scream out 'Marx – yeah!', 'he laughs, 'or '1917 – I was there!' '1917 is the date of the Russian
