BELINDA CARLISLE: I Get Weak (Virgin) I've always thought she was brilliant. She's a real girl's girl. I remember seeing the Go-Gos (all-girl group who Belindo used to sing for who were v. formous in America) on The Tube - it must have been just before they split and then when we were in America two years ago she was having all these hits off her first solo album which was called "Belinda Carlisle". I thought she was great then, and then when "Heaven Is A Place On Earth" came out I thought: 'Brilliant, It deserves to be number one everywhere. I love it.' How different is this from that? It's

not. It's exactly the same. It's not as good but I still think it's fantastic. I listened to her LP last night actually. Are her cheekbones silicone RICK ASTLEY:

e principle of follow up films is simple enough. If you make a film called Killer Mushrooms From Marx and it does really well then you know that loads of people will turn up to see Killer Mushrooms From Mars Two even if it's a load of tosh. However the follow up to Teen Wolf doesn't even have Michael J. Fox in it, and since he was the main reason why the original film was so popular this

means that the chances of this film being anywhere near as popular as the first are pretty ruddy slim. Having said that though, Michael J's replacement is an 18 year old called Jason Bateman, who looks a teensy bit like the original star, (and who actually soldiers his way bravely and very creditably through this rather tacky follow up), and saves the film from being too much of a direct rip off. It's basically a typical US college movie, full of the lapes and pranks that college "kids" get up to (including a rather gruesome frog-throwing fight) and full of the usual goodles and baddies: the baddies in this case are trying to hoodwink young Jason into using his wolf-like powers to win the inter-college boxing you can be pretty sure that there's not much chance of a Teen Wolf Three.







SUPERMAN IV - THE QUEST FOR

PEACE (Warner Home Video, £77.99) s it a bird! Is it a plane? Nope. It's a video – a video of the latest in the Superman series starring Christopher Reeve as the superhuman reporter who flies through the air duffing up no good types. This time he's after the incredibly evil Lex Luthor, whizzing around space save Soviet cosmonauts, rebuilding the Great Wall Of China, thwarting the destruction of The Statue Of Liberty, forcing the sun to go into eclipse etc. In spite of all that effort poor old Superman IV was voted 1987's worst film by the Smash Hits viewers. If you missed it then, now's the chance to see for yourselves.

TIFFANY: Tiffany (MCA) farry seems to be a ple ary sort of girl - so ordinary that if she hadn't been "only" 16 it's beful if anyone would have been at all interested in her or her gimpy single. As it turns out she's an OK singer – not exactly Carol Decker even though she sounds like she'd be a lot happier fronting a rock group than singing this electronic bubblegum. The songs (none of which she has written) are OK too in a rather American sort of way but it's the music that really lets he down. Some of it's completely passionless, a lazy, synthetic nothingness with all the energy and nent of a two chime doorbell. About one more half-ha should see the end of this particular (3 out of 10)

ILLAN GLOVER Accidentally On Purpose Virgin) Cripes! However, metal maniacs need i blub, for it's all pretty "rocky", there's still plenty of meaty Purps-style "axe" riffing and references to "mean muthes" to be had - and, most important of all it is extremely LOUD. CLIMIE FISHER: Everything (EMI) There's a version of "Rise To The Occasion" herein which sounds nothing like the single. It is not a very good version either, since all the interesting disco bits -the bouncing "house" style bass, drumbeat and spook-voices – are nowhere to be heard. What is is a limp ditty which so like a left-over from a not-very-good George Michael LP – and so, apart from the more successful hip hon version, does everything else on the LP (possibly because Simo Climic co-wrote "I Knew You Were Waiting\* for George and Aretha Frankin). The bland violin clad tunes aren't helped by singer Climie's writatingly reedy whine. which makes the songs seem ev weeder than they were to begin with (i.e. pretty ruddy weedy). Maybe Climie Fisher should stick to dance music and leave smooth soulie-pop to the likes of Johnny fates jazz, who do it far mon convincingly. (4 out of 10)

THE POGUES: If I Should Fall From Grace With God (Pogue Mahone) This is the thrd LP by The Pogues and it's THE POGUES: If I Show easily their best effort yet. The first m, "Red Roses For Me" featured too many traditional Irish tunes and not enough by singer Shane MacGowan, the second, "Rum Sodomy And The Lash" had some brillant songs on side one and not many on side two, but "If I Should Fall From Grace With God is at last the near-perfect mix.

There's still the traditional singal ("Medley"), there are plenty of Shane classics ("Birmingham Six", "Lullaby Of London") and, best of all, there are quite a few brilliant joint efforts with barjo player Jem Piner (particularly "Bottle Of Smoke" and "Turksh Song Of The Damned"), plus a wonderful solo contribution by guitarist Philip Chevron whose "Thousands Are Salling" will surely be their next to 10 hit. Funnily enough, the tunes are no longer all based on traditional Irish music but the words

ALL ABOUT EVE: All About Eve (Mercury) Julianne Regan and her three male chums will have to add a bit more zip and punch to their tunes than this to become famous. The songs which include the single "Wild Hearted Woman", are quite pretty lots of swirling guitars à la Mission and they're quite tuneful in sudd bits and pieces but there's nothing strong enough to become a prope hit. And the lyrics have very long hair indeed - you get all this flowery, dreamy stuff about strawberries, gypsy dances and all sound horribly familiar to anyone

It's not just a queston of having a massive hit (e.g. Bros' "When Will I Be Famous?") and then standing still for thirty seconds in front of a Woolies Click 'n' Presto Happy Snap Deluxe camera, as Bros discover . . .

t's 11 am in south east London and a black jeep is winding its way at a preposterously fast pace through the traffic to try and make a 12 o'clock appointment in the north of the city. In it are three people who go by the names of Matthew Goss, Luke Goss and Craig Logan who have showered and spent the morning dressing themselves in

between 12 pm when the jeep pulls up at the studio and 4.45 when they will leave, they'll have around 470 photographs taken of them. up on the cover of Smash Hits

In the last three months how many photo sessions have we done?" ponders Matt "About 20, I reckon. You lose count. But we love the idea of being on magazine covers! We love it! We love it!"

"That's what we're in it for," says Craig 'To be successful," This is the first time we've been on the

front cover of Smash Hits and this is really doin' it for us," bubbles Luke. "I remember

doin' it for us," bubbles Luke. "I remember reading Smash Hits when I was at school, so now being on the cover of it is really quite weird. It's like being on 10p Of The Pops."

These days it's all a part of being a pop star, turning up to photo sessions. And to get exactly the right photo for a cover can be a

long job. First comes make up: when the Bros jeep finally arrives at the studio they all say their "hullo"s to one and all, have a chat with their press officer about the work they've got to do over the next eight days, then disappear, one Kate, the make up woman, awaits with pots of foundation cream, hair gel and powder. Although it might not look like it, by the time a pop star is photographed he is usually covered in layers and layers of make up powder and lip gloss.

Kate has to be prepared for anything. For all she knows a pop star might turn up with the biggest ever spot on his or her nose.

"What if they do?" says Kate. "You just have to hide it by putting on as much make up as possible." And if they've been out a bit too late last night grooving the night away and come in with bloodshot eyes with massive great bags under them? "Yes it happens," grins Kate. "Then you have eyedrops — they're a must. You basically have to turn up with everything just in case. It's just a question of making them look as flattering as possible.

"This lot," she says, indicating the three

members of Bros, "I know it sounds really corny — but they're really good. Some pop stars think they know what they want which can be really difficult

Bros already seem perfectly accustomed to eing made up. "It's quite relaxing," says fatt. "We don't need much make up, so it doesn't take very long.

"We don't need much make up because we're young," explains Craig. Making up a pop star takes a while, explains Kate: "If I'm making up a chap it'll take me 20 minutes or half an hour, if it's a

girl it'll take an hour Which means that it's not till well after one that the first photo is taken. Luke has brought his jeep along for the group to be snapped in: it's still his pride and joy. It's a Suzuki Santana and it cost him £7,000 last summer; he bought it with the money the record company gave the group when they first got

signed. He's already thinking of selling it buy a Porsche when he gets the money He's a bit anxious about the fact that if the jeep's numberplate is photographed people will recognise it so he asks if it can be covered up somehow. A quick phone call to the Smash Hits art department and a special "Bros" numberplate is on its way by motorbike courier to cover the real plate

Next, the photographer's assistant switches on a wind machine, so that it looks like they're driving along in the jeep and the wind is flowing through their hair. The only problem with this idea is that they've all three of them got exceptionally short locks which don't so much as twitch when the giant fan blows at them. All of a sudden Luke has an blows at them. All of a sudden Luke has an "idea". He bounds out of the jeep and attacks the make up artist, stealing the long grey scarf she's wearing. Before she's had time to protest "Hey, what are you doing?" he's gone and tied it to the aeriel where it flutters in the breeze, making it look like the jeep is zooming along the road

Now it's time for the session to begin properly (the photographer, Paul, has already been setting up his lighting and cameras for the last three hours). "OK", barks Paul, "Luke, can you lean out of the window a bit more? Stand up a bit Craig — that's good. Can you grab Matt's jacket? Brilliant!" And the £10,000

we did we'd look like skeletons. The thing about having your photo taken is that you gradually learn how to do it . . . "

"... You see yourself in one picture and you think 'Oh God! Shouldn't do that'," add adds Matt. "And you learn which is your best side.
That's why Craig always wears a paper bag to
photo sessions," he adds as a charming

So how do they make up their minds what to wear for a photo session like this? "Well, replies Craig, "we've basically only got one replies Craig. set of clothes each. "We always wear 501s, we know that Luke:

we're all going to wear Doc Martens, so all we've got to decide is what tops we wear. "I've got loads of t-shirts and stuff but basically I've got five or six pairs of 501s and two pairs of Docs and I always wear the same," says Matt. "We don't wear sequinned boob tubes or anything









