DEACON BLUE: When Will You (Make My Telephone Ring) (CBS) really awful. Nothing more

than a high class, well produced pub band. There's just nothing in there, nothing new or different, it's all horribly bland and boring Andy Bell: It's very seventies-sounding, like a

young Joe Cocker (ancient crumbly who sang the title "track" to the film An Officer And A Gentleman). It sounds like a golden oldie, something you'd hear on an old pub juke
