STEP TWO


Discover a "mer-child" washed ashore and just for that special little extra which comes with being a "benevolent" megasuperstar...autograph its tail! Ouch! Such delight!

BONJOVI - AN "ON THE ROAD" SPECIAL!!!

Life "on the road" is a bit of a tough existence - especially when you're a member of the supercalifragilistic band known throughout the galaxy as **Bon Jovi** - currently squaffing across our fair nation raising "hell" and similar such notions. **Richle Sambora** explains what it all means.

YOU HAVE TO HAVE HUGE AMOUNTS OF "DATES"!

"In America we did 180 shows and we've been out on the road for almost a year now - it's 11 and a half months. The response has been fantastic - we've been all sold out. Everyday before I walk out on stage I thank god that I have the chance to play. We're having a good time. It's a good rock 'n' roll show. It's a premier tour."

YOU LOOK FORWARD TO

COMING BACK TO AUSTRALIA! "We had such a great time there last time and the response was so tremendous. It was a lot of fun and we had a good time. The audiences were the thing I remember most. But we also went up to Cairns for a week and that was just gorgeous and we really enjoyed ourselves. We relaxed on the beach and saw the great Barrier Reef and went boating and fishing and that was great. It's great to go so far and know that your music reaches around the world. Even when we did the Moscow thing over the past couple of months - we went there for the Peace Summit it's pretty touching when your music can get to all those different people."

YOU LOOK FORWARD TO GOING ON HOLIDAYS!

"We finish with this tour in South America in the end of February and after that we're going to take a good holiday. We haven't taken a holiday in many, many years. Right after the 'Slippery When Wet' tour, which was 16 months between writing and recording it was another 8 months and Jon and I took about three weeks off and then we went right back to work on the 'New Jersey' album and we've been on the road ever since. We've had about three weeks off in about four years, so I think we'll take a good year off - if not half a year before we start writing again and enjoy some of the fruits of our work."

YOU DECIDE TO MAKE A SOLO ALBUM IN YOUR SPARE TIME!

"That will happen. That's going to be in the break between this Bon Jovi album and the next Bon Jovi album. Jon and I discussed it and I'm going to do my own record. Lots of different stuff will be on it - I'll be able to explore the music I want to do. I've been writing some stuff and Jon and I are going to write some songs and he's going to help me produce it, so it's not like I'm leaving the band. The whole band's going to be involved and just using me as an avenue - and there'll be a lot of surprise guests on it. Yeah, I'll be doing all the lead vocals. There'll be some blues, some 'black', some rock 'n' roll - a little bit of everything. Verv diversified!"

YOU MAKE RECORDS WITH CHER AND PASH-UP WITH HER AFTERWARDS! "We just got done

with working with Alice Cooper, we worked with Cher again (Richie is currently "involved" with Cherl), we did a song with Paul Young, we did a song for Gorky Park, so this was all on our days off on the road. What did I think of Cher's video? I thought that Cher didn't show enough ass in it! I told her, 'Honey, you should be showing more ass. There's not enough of it!' Hahaha! She's making a movie called Mermaids at the moment but the director might give her a week off and so she might come to Australia for a week. guess this interest in my private life is all a part of it. I know that with Cher, that we're very private and in New Jersey where I come from people just say, 'Hey guys, how ya doin" and they don't really bother us. They're real cool."

And what is the future of the world according to Kate? Dr. Marc Andrews puts his "patient" on the couch for a session and probes her for all matter of "deep" and "intimate" thoughts!

WHAT'S THE BRAVEST THING YOU'VE EVER DONE?

Well, I've never saved anyone from death or any of those heroic sorts of things - although I wish I had. But the bravest thing I've ever done was to tell one of my first boyfriends that I didn't love him anymore. *Hihihiheh!* And he was a pretty aggressive sort of fellow, so I thought that was pretty brave. *Did he beat me up?* No, but he did beat up the nearest wall, *hihiheh!*, if I recall.



WHAT'S YOUR SADDEST MEMORY?

It was a particularly sad case because the horse was born retarded and it had mental problems and they thought rather than letting it live they'd put it down. But I always had horses as pet when I was younger. I had a horse called Julie, which was the most disgusting name that anyone could ever give to a horse, but I didn't name it. But my favourite horse was one called Barney - he was a real person!!! Hihihihihee! He had a personality and was like a large dog. He was intelligent. followed me everywhere and could pole vault on his back! (Er. quite! -Ed.) He just loved you and would do anything for you.

WHAT'S YOUR GREATEST JOY IN LIFE?

My greatest joy? *Hmmmm...*I've got many joys. I love making albums and watching them coming to fruition after so many months and years of hard work. And I think having babies will be another wonderful experience.

That's...um... probably about five years away. WHAT DO YOU TEND TO THINK

OF WHEN YOU'RE IN YOUR BED AT NIGHT?

Well at the moment I'm restoring an apartment that I've just bought. It's 100 years old and it's just got the greatest potential to be the most gorgeous apartment. And I'm just saving my pennies and creating something economically that's going to fit the era and still look beautiful so that's what I think about all the time. And boys! I love boys! You know, I have ten boys in the band and I just love their characters and I love being surrounded by them. Oh, and girls too!

HAVE YOU EVER BEEN PERSECUTED FOR YOUR ORIGINS?

No, not really. There was one incident when I was up the far north coast and I walked by these guys and one of them said, 'That's a cute little darkie chick!' and the other one said to his friend, 'Nah! That's Kate Ceberano!'. I thought that was hilarious. I didn't know what they meant. Did they mean that I was stripped of origin just simply because of my status as a female vocalist? But I'm totally against discrimination of any kind. DO YOU LIKE PEOPLE ASKING

DO YOU LIKE PEOPLE ASKING YOU ABOUT YOUR RELIGIOUS BELIEFS?

It's nice to be asked whether I want a choice to talk about it or not (*i.e. Kate is a practising Scientologist*). Most people decide



it's going to make their story so they ask me everything about it. I like to believe that the reason people are interested in me is for my music. But I feel very strongly about my philosophy and I think it is a good thing that people find out about it. So I don't sort of refrain from talking about it. I don't like it when people start talking about the controversial edge - that's a bore. It's not their place to stir me up on that. Like, I would never go up to a Catholic, a Buddhist, or whatever and get on their back about it. We're all human beings after all. IS THERE ANYONE IN THE **UNIVERSE THAT YOU ABSOLUTELY HATE?**

Um...there probably is but I wouldn't tell you about it -it's a bit close. (Laughs heartily!) No, no no! It's actually part of my philosophy to work on being able to deal and confront problems rather than avoid them. So to hate someone is really doing that in reverse. Ooh, I bet you're really curious now, hihihee! It's not Zan - she was the back-up singer in I'm Talking - I can tell you that. Everyone seems to think that we have a huge problem, but we really quite like each other.

WHAT ONE THING WOULD YOU LIKE TO CHANGE ABOUT YOUR APPEARANCE?

My legs. I'd make them longer and thinner. No! More athletic! I'm a very sportsy person - I go to gym and stuff but I don't think I could ever be an athlete. I've always been too well-endowed to get too involved in physical sports. Did I have to strap myself down? Ha! Yeah and put my harness on! ARE YOU A NUDIST AT HEART?

I'd have to say yes! I like to

wander around the house nude if it's warm enough. Though I don't feel totally comfortable nude. I'm not so worried about what people might see but I feel so vulnerable. I'm conditioned to wearing clothes but I would swim or go to a beach naked quite easily. I just wouldn't do it all the time. I always like having *something* around me and I like having the feel of fabric next to my body. I'm a *sensualis*t at heart! *Hihihee!*

HAVE YOU EVER COMMITTED A CRIME?

I think I shop-lifted once as a kid. Lipsticks it was. I didn't get caught, but my cousin did and so we stopped. It was like a joke up until then. It was sort of like a minirebellion towards our parents at the time, but as I discovered, it wasn't quite a joke and it gave my cousin quite a fright getting picked up by the cops.

WHAT'S THE FUTURE OF THE WORLD?

I would imagine that there'll be an enormous turnaround for peace. I don't believe we'll have another world war. And then maybe the world might blow itself up because of its ecological insanity. It doesn't frighten me but I feel that we really, really need to make a distinct effort to give back the land its dignity and its respect. We should penalise people who litter, destroy and ambush our world and who are making it unliveable. Is it a brave new world ahead? Well I think we're on the verge of either a very doomed world or we do something about it and it could be a very wonderful world.



tears for fears

They were the "toast" of the early '80s, these Sons Of Bath, with their synthesised wizardry and millions of cats and even more millions of LP "sales". Then they disappeared and everyone thought they were dead. But they weren't. They were "in the studio". For four and a half years?!! But why? "Because..." they tell a disbelieving Sylvia Patterson...

"love is the answer..

Let us ponder, for a moment, the time-span that is four and a half years. That's...1,642 days...39,408 hours... enough time for a man to fly to the moon 410 times! That's 6.7 times

longer than the entire life-span of the South American Killifish!!? And that's the time it takes for a group called Tears For Fears to make their *difficult* third LP.

Do you remember Tears For Fears? Curt Smith? The singer with the big googly brown eyes and the pony tail and the cats called Treasure, Garp, Ben, Charlie and Emmy? And Roland Orzabal? The songwriter with the hamster "jowls" and the wavy locks and the one cat called Zero Algebra Waldorf Churchill?

They used to be very famous, The Fears. They were pioneers of the synthesiser "sound" of the early '80s, swirling up the chartways with their eerie electronic numbers like "Mad World" and "Pale Shelter". Then they got supremely famous with their epics "Shout" and "Everybody Wants To Rule The World" and everyone thought they were really super and handsome and clever. And then, at the end of 1984, they disappeared into a black hole. They were Down The Dumper and we thought they'd never trouble us again. But we were wrong – they were merely "in the studio". For four and a half years.

But then The Fears were always a "fussy" lot. Possibly because they are such serious young men. And why not? They're, like, *musicians*, man. Indeed, they were somewhat dubious about talking to their old pals *The Hits* about their latest musical venture at *all*. They didn't want their music "to be trivialised", they said. Croiks. So it's just as well their new tune "Sowing The Seeds Of Love" is an absolute "stoater" of a hippy lerve anthem and has proclaimed them definitely *back* for good. Or at least until they disappear again.

nd so it is a decidedly twitchy Curt Smith who greets us in the posh offices of his record company and perches himself politely on the edge of a super-plush sofa to talk about, erm, his new album. In fact, Curt Smith is quite posh, really – despite having grown up on a council estate in Portsmouth before moving to Bath. He's always using the word "insular" and going on about "moral values" and talking about The Fears being taken to their "logical conclusion" etc. But he's still got those big brown googly eyes and looks genuinely chuffed when one cheeps the salutation "Welcome back, The Fears!"

"Thank you! Thank you. . . it's been long enough. . . Four and a half years between records is a fair enough gap. . ."

And this is what they did: they toured for the whole of 1985, took "a year off" in 1986 "to find ways to improve on what we'd done" and started inventing a new LP in 1987. Ten months later decided they didn't like it much – "we made a few mistakes with producers and things, it was no one's fault" and then started again in 1988 "and it's taken us this long to make an album that we're happy with.

"You see, the thing is..." You see the thing is, readers, there's no stopping Curt when he starts on about his brand new meisterwerk. He loves to talk about how

they wanted to use lots of real musicians this time instead of machines like they used to – because "we didn't get into music to be computer programmers" – and how "the album's certainly different to anything else you'll hear right now. Not saying that it's better, just *different*" and then he gets a bit flustered and says, "um, where was !? What was the question? What was I talking about? Oh, yes, a natural progression..."

t's been a funny old time for Curt lately. As well as making their amazing LP he's separated from his wife, lived in New York for a while and discovered a whole host of incredible hippy ideals – the very ideals he and Roland have let loose upon the world in the form of their new single.

"Well, I don't know if hippy is quite the right word. . . it's very much a Beatles pastiche, for want of a better word. We had these words that were all very reminiscent of the late '60s – 'I love a sunflower' was a piece of graffiti we saw opposite Roland's house and we thought 'that's a lovely image! Then there was this Radio 4 programme about people that copyrighted songs because they weren't owned by anyone and one of the songs was called 'Sowing The Seeds Of Love' so we thought 'what a wonderful title for a song!' And when we'd written it, it felt like a song that very much echoed the sentiments of the '60s, which are good sentiments, I think.

"So the song has a political message. We're touching on moral issues because what we find sick about England right now is that the goals to achieve seem to be success, power and wealth, and those are not great morals. Those are not the things kids or *anyone* should want to achieve in life. The words compassion, care and love are a bit more important, I think. Especially with what's going on in the world right now, with the destruction of the environment and big companies not caring about pollution because if they did care it'd cost them money.

"That's the big issue that the world is facing right now and it's time we got it sorted. So we wanted to write a song that was kind of optimistic. It's naive on one level because we're saying that love is the answer but if you start from this basis, that you change the morals, people start to change their beliefs, and things grow from there, so you're. . . sowing the seeds of love!"

And apart from thinking about the universe and sunflowers and saving the planet during these 54 months, Curt also, um, got depressed in Mexico.

"I was getting back to being a normal human being, calming down and reading a lot. I wanted to become wiser, find out what was happening in the rest of the world. I went to Mexico three times. That was interesting but quite depressing. I was saying to one Mexican man that it was terrible that there were all these people begging on the streets with their kids with a broken arm and he was telling me that 'well. they probably broke their own kid's arm so they can earn more money begging' and that they could earn more that way than working in a factory. They've got a



disgusting government there - they don't give a shit. I'd love to see a Government' that doesn't try to keep the people down and ignorant and tell lies but they all do even the one here. Look at inflation!"

CON

Ahurm. Curt Smith is a bit of a "thinker". You will find that most of The Fears' pop songs are actually "about something we care about" and they have no truck with pop groups that rumble on about their "bay-baaays" and a load of flimsy old "drivel"

"That's true, but I'm not saying we're better than other people. Believe me, I'm not. It's just we, as people, cannot bring ourselves to make vacuous pop music. That's just us - this is what we're thinking about and this is what's going on in the world. Other people make vacuous pop music and that's fine. It's like The Sun - I'd rather it wasn't there but that's life.

It must be a bit weird being The Fears and being back. For a while they were the band that the girlies chased down the street and who got fistfuls of hair prised out of their heads etc. It must have been mental becoming completely unfamous again. . .

"Becoming unfamous. . . heheh. Well, that was a conscious effort. We're musicians and I find it hard to be at ease with becoming public property. I really hate that. So that's why we take these breaks. It's nice to be forgotten."

Remind Curt of the olden days when they were the "hunks" of the decade and he looks not a little perplexed.


"I didn't want it then, either! And as we got older we're not going to get that any more. I'm not 21 any more! I'm 28! That's nearly 30! I went to Radio 1 the other day and I got out of the limousine and I heard all these kids saying 'Who's 'ee? What does 'ee do? Must be someone famous. . .' And I actually thought, 'This is great! This is really nice... I can stroll in here and not be bothered.' I mean, we put a lot of time and effort into our music and I'd hate it to be trivialised. It would be nice if people could get into it on a deeper level than just 'ooooh, eee's nice'. Or 'eeeee's 'orrible!!' whatever the case may be! Hmnhmnh. . . "


nd *that*, readers, is a classic Curt Smith "laugh" which is actually a mumble in disguise. He does a lot of them. He also sighs a lot after he's answered a question, bless 'im. Does he still have the cats, one wonders? "The cats? Mnmnmn. They're all in

different places. Farmed them, out, yes. I, uh, split up with my wife so. . . It's not that horrendous - y'know, shit happens. We're still friends, we see each other and now we've gone on to meet other people and it's all fine. And maybe it was a good thing because I had to learn to be independent for the first time in my life, because I moved straight in with Lynne after leaving home. Obviously you have to grow up a lot when that happens to you.

The Fears have also been studing the "science" of astrology.

"Well, that's more Roland but I'm interested. Because some of it rings too true to ignore. Roland once had this





psycho-astrological chart done for me by this woman called Liz Green and when you get 165 pages of text through about yourself from someone who's never met you and you can't fault it, you think, well, there's got to be something in it." So what sign are you?

"I'm a Cancerian. .

Ah! So that means you're moody. And emotional and secretive and sentimental and you've got a face that looks like the moon!

'Mnnmnn!! Yeah, I'm all those things. I'm a typical Cancerian, unfortunately, so people can see right through me!

I see you've cut your pony-tail off. "Mmmnmnn. When I was younger I was fashion conscious. (?) Because you are when you're young. So for me I started. to be... fashionably unconscious! Mmnmeheh. It's a difficult time in your early twenties because you're still trying to hold on to your youth. Now I'm quite comfortable being an adult. I've got grey hair! 



When you were a toddler what were your ambitions? "One of my first ambitions

was to be a dancer, but then as I got older, because of the way my family lived, I wanted to be really normal things like a nurse or an air hostess. It wasn't that everyone was wild and crazy and berserk - my family weren't lunatics! - I think it was just that you always want to do the opposite thing to what people are doing in your immediate environment. My dad was a musician and my mum was an artist so I wanted to be a nurse! Haha!"

How did you get on with your parents? "Um, my mother was definitely

"Um, my mother was definitely the most important person in my life when I was young. But it wasn't till I moved away from home that we became friends - when I was at home I used to fight her a lot. I couldn't fight with my dad y'know - he could control me. I was scared of him! But with my mum I could actually really kick up a fuss. I got aggravated by the things in her that were like me! I think that's quite usual with mothers and daughters."

Why did you leave school when you were 14?

"I always stress that I left school out of weakness - I think that knowledge is one of the most important things you can have. I think that I was weak - I was becoming a passive, pathetic person. I just got to the stage where I didn't care any more. So I woke up to the fact that if I didn't do something about the way that I was getting which was almost, like, ignoramus, - I was gonna leave school at 18 with nothing left, no vibe, no nothing. But when I left school I didn't think I was gonna leave for ever - I thought that I'd only be gone a year and do a few other things and then pick up the pieces. Which I was prepared to do.

What did you do then? "I worked, because my family has never been well-off financially, so I had to make my own keep and I wanted clothes and, uh, extras hehe. I did a lot of babysitting, and I had a cleaning job and I did some office work, deliveries, little bits and pieces.

"It was tough but it was really interesting - it was nice being given a bit of responsibility. One of the main problems in Neneh Cherry is, unfortunately, not a very well girl at the moment. (You can read more about that on Dazz! -Ed.) But just prior to her current stretch of ill-health, Miranda Sawyer had a chance to do the most in-depth interview that Neneh's ever done!

schools is that young people aren't taken seriously and they're not being taught about responsibility. I think that all people are creative people. y'know - I don't think that only people in music or in the arts are creative, I think the same sort of energy goes into being a computer operator. It depends on what you want as an individual. I don't think that sort of energy is stimulated in people in the right way in school. More often than not, you're just being squared down into fitting into society, taking up the best options that are being offered. And they're so limited; people end up going 'What can I be? Okay, I'll be a secretary.'

So how did you get involved in music then?

"Um, my dad (Don Cherry, a jazz trumpeter) took me on a tour in Britain when I was 15 because he thought it would be a good experience for me. There were three bands on the tour and I met a lot of people that I ended up working with. I went back to New York, but I had kinda connected with a lot of people in England and it was through that that I was asked to come and join Rip Rig And Panic (Neneh's first music 'combo') came back to New York and then I got a phonecall asking me to come and sing with them.

Was it difficult having Naima (*i.e. her first child*) when you were so young?

"It was a conscious decision it wasn't an accident. I started having my teenage period when I was pretty young so by the time I got to seventeen I felt I was ready for it. Um, I think that I'd like to stress to *Smash Hits* readers that a baby is a lifelong commitment. I'm always wary of like making it sound like it's something that's gonna solve all your problems. It's each to their own and I'd hate to inspire a really young person into having a kid at the wrong time."

Was it more difficult having Tyson, you being a famous pop type by that time? No, it was a lot easier. Physically she just popped out. I had her in a hospital but only just - if there had been a traffic jam I wouldn't have made it! Also, it was easier because I'd already had Naima - I was a lot more easygoing about it. With Naima I was so determined to survive, to make it, that I was a lot more aggressive - not with her, but in the way I was approaching my life. With Tyson I've been able to lay back a bit more and enjoy her. Also I feel really supported by Cameron (i.e. Cameron McVey, Neneh's boyfriend) Actually, I feel having a baby has made things easier, even though technically it's harder! Naima and Tyson are a good distraction, v'know! Haha! They stop me getting too serious about things. Who's your best friend? "I've got a few priceless female friends. Andrea, who was in the 'Manchild' video, she's like family to me. I think that women tend to have more close real friends than men have. Women are less competitive and they find it easier to be honest with each other and cry with each other. But that's really a generalisation - I know lots of men who have close male

friends. Anyway, my best friend is Cameron. Putting our relationship to one side. I think that the reason that we can work together and be together as lovers as we are is because we are best friends. And I think that if you're gonna have a relationship with someone it's really important that you're not just in love with each other, that that isn't everything. Being friends is essential. Otherwise it'll probably break up anyway. I

think so."

Do you consider yourself a political person?

"Definitely. I keep up with the world's politics. I'm very concerned about the way I see the world is going. I don't approve of the basic politics that seem to be in power all over the Western world - a lot of governments have real right wing tendencies. I consider myself a conscious person. I try and stay in touch with things that are happening in the world, in China, in South Africa, all over"

You've lived in the States and in Britain - which society's politics do you prefer?

Britain's, because I think that Britain isn't as far gone as America - but unless things change soon, things will be as bad. Basically, people with money are getting richer and people without money are not getting any richer. Money's being taken away from schools, from the arts. Nothing's being set up to deal with people who have drug habits, people who are suffering from AIDS, there's nothing there to deal with people who are being victimised.

"One of the reasons why things seem to have got worse violence, drugs, crime, is because young people are not being offered alternatives and yet they're being told that they should be achieving all the time. People are being pushed into being over-ambitious, upwardly mobile, and when they don't make it, it makes them frustrated. There's a serious yuppie invasion." What do you think happens to you when you die? "I think that going to heaven is something that you experience during your lifetime. The test of life is whether you can find peace and happiness, and once forever. It puts you in your place. Do I believe in God? I believe in life, love, spirit and the soul and I suppose that's what people call God. But I think that when you call it God it gives you a picture of a man. God is something that's in everybody. Everyone's looking for the same thing at the end of the day. Happiness really.'

Are you happy?

"I've never been happier, I just hope that I'll feel this way for a long, long time."



TOP MARX FOR RICHARD!

He came! He saw! He topped the charts! That's Richard Marx we're talking about, bucko! But he's still very much a mystery man. Marc Andrews thought it time to get to know "Dickie" just a little bit better...and let you read all about it too, *of course!!!*

I'm the boy next door, the rock 'n' roll kid. I'm beyond good and evil, I'm not threatening, and I'm not a wimp, in fact I'm right there in the middle like Bryan Adams."

Bryan Adams indeed! *Pah!* Richard Marx, he of the recent Australian tour, No.1 single and album, and "controversial" hairstyle, has now become a fully-fledged star with a look (*ahem!*) and style all his own. But what mysteries lurk in his devious background? Why *did* he deny writing songs for Kenny Rodgers when he was "a guest" in Oz? Does he even exist!?!! Time to "unearth the dirt" on the most famous Marx brother of them all then, readers!

Rich was born in Chicago in 1964 where his father made a living as a jazz pianist and top "jingle" writer.

Due to Dad being "in the business", Rich was brought in on a number of occasions to sing on these advertisements and it was then that

young Dick decided his future lay in music. "I always wanted to be in music, and


You'll never be rid of the findstc, and play, sing, produce, write and arrange. You'll never be rid of me *hahahaha!* I knew as soon as I started writing songs that I wanted out of the jingle business. I started writing at 17 because I couldn't find material that I wanted to do as a singer."

Rich then decided, as with most aspiring "musos", to make a "demo" tape of his spiffing tunes. Somehow, the tape that he made found its way into the hands (and ears!) of Lionel Ritchie. Lionel. so impressed with Richard's work, invited him to come and sing some backing vocals on his megaselling "Can't Slow Down" LP.

"After I met Lionel, I immediately knew LA was where I had to be. I packed my stuff, moved out from Chicago and began working on Lionel's album as a backing singer."

Thanks to Lionel's help, Richard made





many invaluable contacts in the music world and for the next couple of years began writing and co-writing material for performers as diverse (and some might say "yawnsome"!!!) as Chicago, Philip Bailey and...Kenny Rogers. Although he denied it on The Ray

Although he denied it on *The Ray Martin Show* when he was here, Rich most certainly *did* co-write two songs for Kenny Rogers. He later explained why he lied by saying, "It was a mistake. I didn't mean to deny the Kenny Rogers thing or anything else, but all that was a long time ago. I've established myself. I don't want to be reminded of grim details of my past." Perhaps we should

wove on then, eh??!! wove on then, eh??!! we released his first solo album, a self-titled affair, in 1986. It spawned four American Top 5 singles: "Don't Mean Nothing", "Should've Known Better", "Endless Summer Nights" and "Hold On To The Nights". He also started his first major tour as

He also started his first major tour as support with a terribly-dreary old American band with the even more terrible name of REO Speedwagon.

"Touring has been as important, if not more important, than anything we've done," declares Rich. "We were out on the road for six months, give or take a couple of weeks. And when we weren't on the road, sales of the album dipped a bit. So I saw right there in black and white that touring definitely affected sales."

And so Richard played over 200 dates across the length and breadth of his homeland and subsequently his album remained on the charts for a staggerizing year-and-a-half. He was also nominated for a Grammy Award and even selected as one of the 10 sexiest men in rock'n'roll by *Playgirl* magazine. (*Corill*) But Richard wasn't overly impressed by this last accolade.

"Look at me, bloody look at me," he once eschewed. "I'm not exactly George Michael am I eh!?!!"

Erm...anyway...after all that fuss, Richard might have been expected to go and have a nice quiet holiday for a few years and even get a proper haircut. Instead, he went quite barking mad with work. Apart from co-writing the hit "Surrender To Me" from the movie Tequila Sunrisé, co-writing and producing the Vixen track "Edge Of A Broken Heart", writing and producing tracks for his wife Cynthia Rhodes' band Animotion and doing a song on the *Sing* soundtrack as well as co-writing a host of other numbers for some old friends, he had that all-important second album to consider. And as with everything he chooses to do, he was taking it very seriously.

"Some people might think that it would be easier this time around," attests Sir Rich, "that I could just kick back. But the truth is, it's harder, I've got more to prove. So I've tried to make an album that takes me further than the first one."

That second album, aptly-titled "Repeat Offender", (a title he chose to annoy his critics) became an even bigger hit than the first and spawned his first Australian No.1 single, "Right Here Waiting".

Richard also embarked on a huge world tour in support of the album which brought him to Australia and if ever there was a performer eager to "kick ass live" (as they say!) then it was to be Mr. Marx himself.

"When I was out there for so long I got tired of hotels and started hating touring. But now I'm chomping at the bit to be back. Once it gets in your blood, it becomes something that's a part of your life."

And as to whether Richard with his renowned blow-waved "quiff" is specifically concerned with his image more than his music, well, it has come time for Richard to have the last word.

"As long as people like the music I don't give a toss what they say. I hope I'm not hip and trendy, because if you're hip and trendy, you're here today and not here tomorrow. I'd rather be a mainstay and known for music that's gonna last."






GHOSTBUSTERS II

"With the strike," she recalls, "I had to fly on Hercules army planes and travel on trains with sleeper carriages which didn't attach properly, so my bed kept going up and down all night! Actually, when I first found out that I'd be flying over to Melbourne every week (to work on the Docs), I thought 'Yeah! This is hot!, but by the end I HATED it!!! I'd be spending a week in Melbourne and then going back to Adelaide - whatever way I could get back - and spend at least a day catching up on the washing and ironing and cleaning and unpacking, then packing again to come back. And because I had to miss some time doing Kids, I had to do shows we had in Adelaide called Saturday Fun Day and Kids Sunday on the weekend to make up."

Thankfully, that hectic spell is now in the past. Tammy has finished work on C'Mon Kids ("They're great people and I'll miss working with the kids because they're so much fun") and moved to Melbourne permanently, shifting her belongings into Peter O'Brien's house in bayside St. Kilda (not far away from co-star Alex Papps "abode") while Pete is off overseas being a star in England. It's a return home for Tammy. Now 19, she was born in Melbourne before moving westwards across the Nullabor to Perth with her mum and dad when she was a "mere" eight years of age. And with a dad who lectures in theatre and drama at university there, performing was "in the blood" from an early stage.

"I started dancing when I was twelve and spent a good three or four years doing vaudeville theatre in a voluntary dance troupe," sprouts Tammy at a rapid speed. "Then a further three years at a contemporary dance centre in Perth, which was very good training discipline and confidence-wise. Dancing to me is something *everyone* should do, because you have to express so much to get its message across to people. It's really helped me a lot."

After she finished school, Tammy landed a job on a local Young Talent Time-type show called Teamworkz, dreaming of a living dancing in pop videos working for Paula Abdul who, Tammy bubbles, is. a"living legend". Six months there and it was on to Adelaide and C'mon Kids for another eight months. Then, in a roundabout sort of way, The Flying Doctors beckoned.

"My agent in Perth called and said 'You've got an audition for a mini-series called Jackaroo with Crawfords (the people who produce Flying Doctors) for the lead role of Clare, which Annie Jones eventually got. And I was really scared because I'd never auditioned before and I had all these scripted scenes to do (continues on in an animated fashion for ten minutes or so about how she enjoyed it and how challenging it all was, comparing it, strangely, to a boy she's going out with who had been asked out by Dannii Minogue and wanted to do it but didn't want to hurt Tammy and so didn't tell her and ended up in a total emotional tizz !!!) ... so, I went back to C'mon Kids and Crawfords rang and said 'Look, because you haven't done any acting before, the 12-week shoot for *Jackaroo* would be really hard. So, we want to use you for The Flying Doctors instead because you'll have time to learn from the cast and crew, and it's the best drama in Australia. BOARDWALKING Dear Dazz.

Can you please tell me who recorded the song "Under The Boardwalk" and in what year? So far I have heard versions of that song by Bruce Springsteen, The Rolling Stones, Bruce Willis, John Cougar Mellencamp and, of course, Bette Midler. Thanks!

The Boardwalker, Punchbowl, NSW. Famous (?) American rhythm and blues group The Drifters were first cab off the rank with "Under The Boardwalk". They recorded it in 1964 and it was a big, big hit all over the world. None of those cover versions mentioned above have come close to matching the original in terms of sales, and in fact Under The Boardwalk" was only one of a squillion hits that the Drifters had from the early 1950s until the mid-70s. But it wasn't the same talented bunch all the time - in fact, true to their name, more than 50 individuals have drifted through the group! I can add two other versions of "Boardwalk" to the above: Tom Tom Club's version in 1982 and the one performed by Feargal Sharkey's old group The Undertones in 1980.


