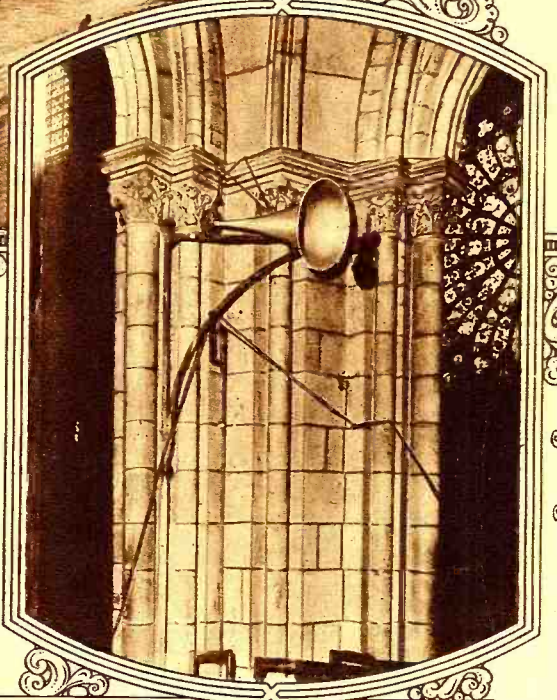
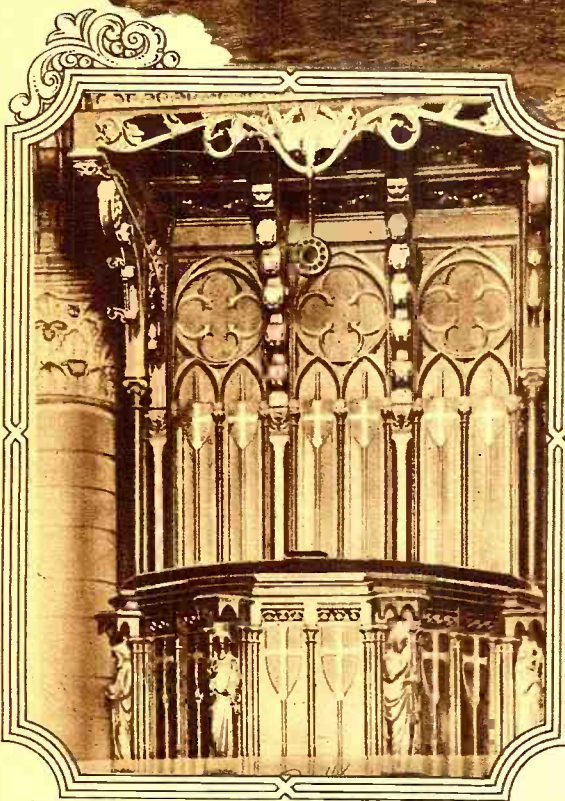


Radio in Old Cathedral

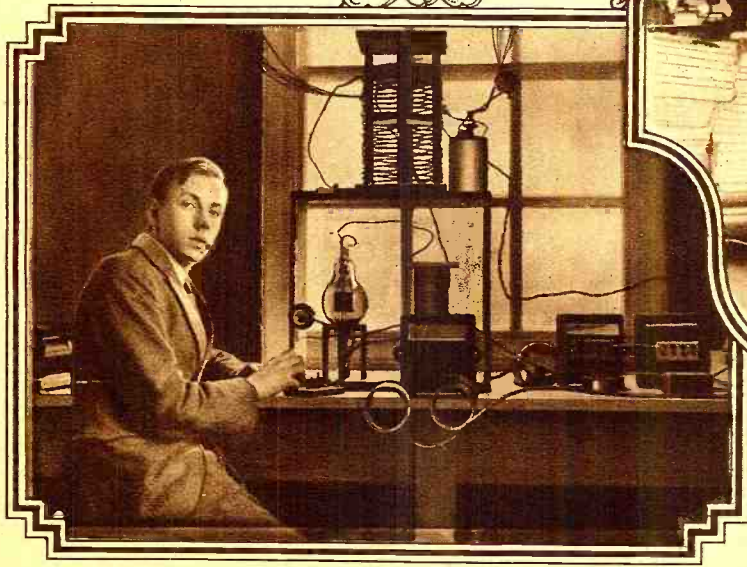
